## THE JOINT LICENSE FOR THE LOWER PARTS OF OULANKA- AND KITKAJOKI RIVERS

Oulankajoki: The lower part of Nurmisaari – Boundary zone Kitkajoki: From Jyrävä's Linnakallio to 100 meters up from the river fork of Kitkajoki

Kitkajoki's trouts and graylings have surprised many fishers, and the beautiful scenery surrounding the river is at least as famous if not more. Kitkajoki has a reputation as one of the most difficult rivers to catch fish in, so it is best suited for people who are looking for exercise and hiking.

The fishing spots in the six-kilometer-long area between Jyrävä and Päähkänä are mostly small. The river runs mostly as rocky rapids. The only larger quiet waters, Jyrävä and Harrisuvanto, are both in the favor of trout fishers. Linnakallio and the area between Heinäniemi and Kalliosaari are also good trout spots. You can also find favorable fishing spots along the river in the areas between Vennäänniemi and Ahvenperä.
